- Our way of doing this is by building community hubs of which Academies are a key part.




Ethos

Houses

Classes have been placed in houses to help create a vertical identity across the school. The houses are named after birds. The idea is we have trees for our class names which give us roots so our houses can be the birds that help us fly.

Hawthorn - Firecrest

Birch - Skylark

Pine - Hummingbird

Chestnut -Kookaburra



Safeguarding

- Safeguarding is at the heart of everything we do.
- We have a safeguarding team as well as all staff receiving regular training.
- As a school we ask the children to have two safe adults who they can ask to speak to.
- In classes we each have worry boxes where children can express to us if they need an adult.





P.E Days

Children will now have two PE lessons a week. Please send your children into school wearing their PE kit. They will then stay in their kit all day.

P.E kit is black shorts/trousers, a white t-shirt and black trainers/plimsoles.

Chestnut's PE day - Monday and Wednesday Birch's PE day - Monday and Wednesday

Hawthorn's PE day -Tuesday and Thursday Pine's PE day -Tuesday and Thursday



Reading

School:

- Children have a class book which will be read aloud to them for up to 15 minutes every day.
- There is additional class reading time everyday where children will read their book to their teacher one to one or independently.
- We also use key books as a spring board for writing.

Home:

- Your child should be reading daily for 15-20 minutes. Please use the book provided by the class teacher or other books you have available at home. Children will be able to go to our library to change their books once a week.
- Speak with your child's class teacher if you have further questions or difficulty encouraging your child to read at home.



Reading with your child

Children will normally read to you however it is also beneficial for them to hear you reading out loud. Your child benefits from hearing you modelling fluency and expression, as well as from hearing texts that are above their level of reading.

When you are listening to them read, as well as accuracy, listen out for; <u>fluency</u> and <u>expression</u>.

Fluency: words should flow smoothly and naturally, pausing at commas and full stops.

Expression: tone of voice might show emotion, or

emphasise particular words.



Reading Records

The parent or other adult should add a comment with the date, book and pages read.

Children can also:

- write out any tricky words or new words learnt
- review the reading 'Top Tips' with an adult
- highlight words they know on the word list.

Children must bring their reading book to school everyday as they will be reading it in class daily.



Comments in Reading Records

Here are some examples of comments your children might make in their reading record:

- I learned ... from this book.
- I predicted that ..., and it did/did not happen
- · We discussed what we think about issue
- My favourite character was ... because
- I liked/did not like the book/chapter because ...
- I predict that ... will happen in the next chapter





Spellings

School:

- Year 3 children will have new spellings weekly.
- New spellings will be sent home on Fridays on ClassDojo.
- There will be no spelling test in school but these are words that we are using in lessons that we expect them to spell correctly

Home:

- Support your child with their spelling home learning.
- Try out the activities listed on the next slide.
- Speak with your child's class teacher if you have further questions or difficulty encouraging your child to practise their spellings.



Helping with Spelling at home:

- Use different strategies to help children learn the words and spelling pattern, including:
 - · looking out for spelling pattern in reading book.
 - using 'Say, Spell, Say' strategy with word visible
 - practice spelling pattern with handwriting helps reinforce letter sequence.
 - repeatedly writing the word using different colours "rainbow writing".
 - Writing in the air/sand/stick in the ground.
 - Making the words out of magnetic letters, playdough, plasticine etc.
 - making and using flash cards.
 - writing sentences with the new words.




Writing

- This year our writing is based on the scheme 'The Write Stuff'- Jane Considine.
- Over the year we will introduce children to various symbols which will help to build on their writing techniques.











How you can help

- Encourage your child to write shopping list,
 story, diary, instructions for a video game etc.
- Talking with your children to encourage thought.
- Read the words
- Support them in spelling either by using phonics or letter names if it is not phonetically decodable.

Maths

To help your child you could:

- Log on to Sumdog, Times Tables Rockstars,
 Top Marks, and 1-minute Maths at home
- Have your child help with everyday activities –
 paying for the shopping, telling the time, days
 of the week, months, shapes around us,
 counting in odds and evens, counting in 2, 3,4,
 5, 8 and 10, reading higher numbers such as
 bus numbers



Spanish

In year 3, we have weekly Spanish lessons. We are very lucky that each child has an account on Duolingo so please encourage your children to use this fantastic app as much as you can.



General

- Homework expectations Homework passports will be sent home at the beginning of each term via ClassDojo. Please complete the tasks in as much or as little detail as you wish. Remember to sign each task when completed for your child to receive a certificate at the end of term.
- Please send your child in with a coat which is clearly labelled. Please also label cardigans and jumpers.
