
The 'Thematic Curriculum' formally known as Topic, will be a combination of the following lessons:

Curriculum Overview – English Writing

These are the curriculum overviews for the year ahead. English writing will use the Jane Considine scheme of writing.









The writing curriculum specifically meets the OCL statement of intent by focusing on character, competence, and community in the following areas:



Character: All children will see relatable characters and themes in quality literature that exemplify the Oasis ethos and 9 habits. All children will experience texts that reflect cultural, social and linguistic diversity, as well as introducing a world beyond the familiar. They will recognise how we are all continually developing our character and can be transformed into the best versions of ourselves by overcoming challenges with resilience.

Competence: All children will be functionally literate and flourish inside and outside the classroom, regardless of their starting points. Focussed learning will be the foundation of every lesson with an emphasis on knowledge and skills that are spaced, progressive and revisited. All children will develop their own voice and have a choice about what they want to communicate with others.

Community: All children will be given the opportunity to connect with and explore their local community in order to become representatives, leaders and mentors and shape, influence and improve it. All children will be cultivated as writers who both care and have a message to share.





Curriculum Overview – English Reading

These are the curriculum overviews for the year ahead. English reading will follow the structure below.

Overview of the year: In year 4 we teach reading across the week in the following structure:

Comprehension	Read Aloud	Independent Reading
30 minutes per day:	15 minutes per day:	15 minutes day:
Daily comprehension session which will focus on the domains of reading: Vocabulary, Inference, Prediction, Explaining and Evaluating, Retrieval and Summarising/Sequencing. This will include planned opportunities to practice skills of reading which are scaffolded, modelled, and then independently executed.	Mapped Read Aloud entitlement shared with children daily.	Dedicated time allocated for developing independent reading behaviours through Accelerated Reader.



Curriculum Overview – Maths

In year 4 we focus on all areas of maths, building on the work of year 3 through the following units of work planned using the core concepts.





Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check (MTC)

- The multiplication tables check (MTC) is statutory for primary schools in the 2022/23 academic year.
- The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables <u>up to 12</u> fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will help schools to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided.
- The MTC will take place in May.
- Children must practice their timetables for at least 10 minutes everyday at home.

Curriculum Overview – P.E

Indoor PE will focus on fitness, gymnastics and tennis.

 This must be removed for PE lessons.
- Students with long hair should tie it up. This is essential for PE lessons.
- Make-up and nail varnish is not allowed at school.
- Hair accessories should be discrete, preferably black or purple.
- Every article of clothing must be marked with the student's name
- Each student is responsible for his or her own clothing
- No clothing may be borrowed or loaned
