Dear Parent/Carers

Welcome back, I hope that you had a restful half term break.

Sadly despite my many requests, we had a near miss outside our Long Lane campus this week, with a parent being hit by a car, the driver drove onto the kerb and over the zig-zag lines at drop off time. Thankfully, no-one was seriously hurt, but this could so easily not have been the case. How many more near misses do we need before everyone starts driving in a responsible and safe manner? We will keep working on what we as a school can do to improve the safety on our roads, but ultimately we rely on drivers following the laws of the road and showing patience and common sense.



Internet Safety About Tik Tok

Is TikTok safe? How does it work?

Everything you need to know about this popular musical singing and sharing app.

TikTok - Real Short Videos is a free social media app that lets you watch, create, and share videos -- often to a soundtrack of the top hits in music. It was originally available as musical.ly in the U.S. but was rebranded when the two apps merged in August 2018. Tik Tok is incredibly popular, owing in part to its slick mash-up of features from other kid favourites. Users can watch and record videos of themselves lip-synching to popular music and sound bites. Kids can create short, shareable videos ranging from funny to serious. Tik Tok is an interactive world of videos that lets you connect with friends and admirers through likes, comments, and even duets.

But with so much information out there, it can be a challenge for parents to know if it's really safe. While TikTok videos are mostly harmless, creative fun, there are real concerns about kids using the app. As with any social media, you have to use privacy settings to limit how much information you and your kids are sharing. Kids can post stuff without reviewing or editing it first. There have even been reports of online predators using the app to target younger users.

What parents can do to make it safer

When you sign up for TikTok, your account is public by default, meaning anyone can see your videos, send you direct messages, and use your location information. Parents should make sure to turn on all privacy settings for accounts kids are using, so only people you know can interact with your videos or message you on the app. Because of TikTok's emphasis on popular music, many videos include swearing and sexual lyrics, so it may not be age-appropriate for kids to use on their own. It's also easy to find people wearing revealing clothing and dancing suggestively, although TikTok won't let you search for objectionable content such as "sex" or "porn." If you supervise your kids and stick to songs you already know from the radio, TikTok can be a kid-friendly experience. As of 2019, in response to a lost lawsuit, the developers created a separate section of the app for kids under 13 that only allows them to access curated, clean videos: They can't comment, search, or post their own videos. However, bypassing that section only requires entering a false birthdate. TikTok requires that users be at least 13 years old to use the app and that anyone under the age of 18 must have approval of a parent or guardian. If your younger kid or tween wants to use the app, the account should belong to an adult who can monitor what younger users are browsing and sharing. It's important to note that new challenges are arising on the internet all the time. We have created to this guide to raise awareness of the issue and offer advice on helping parents to talk to their children about making safer decisions online. Momo is a sinister 'challenge' that has been around for some time. It has recently resurfaced and once again has come to the attention of schools and children across the country. Dubbed the 'suicide killer game', Momo has been heavily linked with apps such as Facebook, WhatsApp, YouTube, and most recently (and most worryingly)... YouTube Kids. The scary doll-like figure reportedly sends graphic violent images, and asks users to partake in dangerous challenges like waking up at random hours and has even been associated with self-harm. It has been reported that the 'Momo' figure was originally created as a sculpture and featured in an art gallery in Tokyo and unrelated to the 'Momo' challenge we are hearing about in the media.

CHILDREN'S VIDEOS BEING 'HIJACKED'

There have been recent reports that some seemingly innocent videos on YouTube and YouTube Kids (such as 'surprise eggs', unboxing videos and Minecraft videos) have been edited by unknown sources to include violence provoking and/or other inappropriate content. Even though YouTube monitor and remove videos that include inappropriate content, clips can be uploaded and viewed thousands of times before they get reported and removed. As a parent, it's difficult to spot these videos as the harmful content doesn't appear until partway through the video.

DISTRESSING FOR CHILDREN

Popular YouTubers and other accounts have been uploading reaction videos, showing their experience of the MOMO challenge. Some of the videos include a disclosure message warning that the content may be "inappropriate or offensive to some audiences" and that "viewer discretion is advised" but these videos are still easily accessed by clicking 'I understand and wish to proceed'. The image of the 'Momo' character can be deeply distressing to children and young people and it's important to note that it may slip through parental settings and filters.

SUGGESTED VIDEOS ON YOUTUBE

Video apps such as YouTube include an 'up next' feature which automatically starts playing another video based on the video just watched. Due to YouTube's algorithm, users are shown 'suggested videos' that they may be interested in. The thumbnails used on suggested videos are purposefully created in a way to encourage viewers to click them. During our research, we found that when watching one Momo related video, we were shown countless other Momo themed videos and other scary content which would be age-inappropriate for children under 18.

Top Tips for Parents

TELL THEM IT'S NOT REAL

Just like any urban legend or horror story, the concept can be quite frightening and distressing for young people. Whilst this may seem obvious, it's important for you to reiterate to your child that Momo is not a real person and cannot directly harm them! Also, tell your child to not go openly searching for this content online as it may only cause more distress.

BE PRESENT

It's important for you, as a parent or carer, to be present while your children are online. This will give you a greater understanding of what they are doing on their devices, as well as providing you with the opportunity to discuss, support and stop certain activities that your child may be involved in. As the nature of each task become progressively worse it's also important to recognise any changes in your child's behaviour.

TALK REGULARLY WITH YOUR CHILD

As well as monitoring your child's activity, it's important for you discuss it with them too. Not only will this give you an understanding of their online actions, but those honest and frequent conversations will encourage your child to feel confident to discuss issues and concerns they may have related to the online world.

DEVICE SETTINGS & PARENTAL CONTROLS

Ensure that you set up parental controls for your devices at home. This will help to restrict the types of content that your child can view, as well as help you to monitor their activity. In addition to this, it's vital that you are aware of your device and account settings to ensure your child's utmost safety. For example, on YouTube you can turn off 'suggested auto-play' on videos to stop your child from viewing content that they have not directly selected.

PEER PRESSURE

Trends and viral challenges can be tempting for children to take part in; no matter how dangerous or scary they seem. Make sure you talk to your child about how they shouldn't succumb to peer pressure and do anything they are not comfortable with, online or offline. If they are unsure, encourage them to talk to you or another trusted adult.

REAL OR HOAX?

As a parent it is natural to feel worried about certain things you see online that may be harmful to your child. However, not everything you see online is true. Check the validity of the source and be mindful of what you share as it may only cause more worry.

REPORT & BLOCK

You can't always rely on parental controls to block distressing or harmful material. People find ways around a platform's algorithm in order to share and promote this type of material. Due to this, we advise that you flag and report any material you deem to be inappropriate or harmful as soon as you come across it. You should also block the account/content to prevent your child from viewing it. Also encourage your child to record/screenshot any content they feel could be malicious to provide evidence in order to escalate the issue to the appropriate channels.

FURTHER SUPPORT

Speak to the safeguarding lead within your child's school should you have any concerns regarding your child's online activity or malicious content that could affect them.

If your child sees something distressing, it is important that they know where to go to seek help and who their trusted adults are. They could also contact Childline where a trained counsellor will listen to anything that's worrying them.



Dear Parent/Carer,

To celebrate and encourage a lifelong love of reading at home and school, we will be running a sponsored read / sponsored listen between Monday 4th March and Monday 11th March. The project is being organised in conjunction with a popular children's bookseller, and all the money raised will go towards brand new reading books for our school.

In addition to the sponsorship money, the bookseller will also donate up to 60% of the total raised in **EXTRA FREE BOOKS** to the school. So for every £600 raised, we will get an extra £360 in **FREE** books! If every child could just raise £1, it would mean we would have nearly £1000 to spend on books for our reading corners. In Year 1

Next week, we are celebrating World Book Day with a week of fun activities. We will be having a scavenger hunt where we will be trying to find lots of different things in a variety of books. We will be reading some Julia Donaldson books and then deciding which one is our favourite. For our writing on Friday we will be writing a book review of it. In maths, we will be using non-standard units to measure and we will also be comparing lengths. In PSHE, we will be looking at the themes that are in 'The Gruffalo' and generating philosophical questions around them. Have a lovely weekend,

In Year 4

In Year 4, we will continue our work based on our new book 'Oliver and the Seawigs'. In Maths we will focus on using understanding of place value to solve subtraction problems using appropriate methods. In Topic, we will continue to learn about Explorers and in Science we will study 'Sound'. In PHSE we will be learning more about our habit this half-term - honesty. This is alongside lessons in S.F.A, P.E, French, Spanish, RE and Art.

In Year 2

Next week in topic, we will read and discuss Samuel Pepys' diary. We will then plan and write a diary entry about the Great Fire of London. Our writing focus will be in writing as the first person, structuring our work in paragraphs and adding connectives to extend our sentences. In Maths, we will carry on exploring our unit of learning about *Money*. During this week, we will find the total of a set of coins and make the same total using different coins, we will calculate change from one pound and will create an amount of money in different ways. In Science, we will learn about the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food and hygiene. During this lesson we will discover the food pyramid and we will look at the food groups. In PHSE, we will explore this term's habit of Honesty. We will look to understand the meaning of words such as honest, dishonest and conscience. We will read the story 'Anna's Monster Lies' and discuss the importance of honesty in maintaining our friendships. Have a great weekend.

In Year 5

In English next week, we are writing a diary entry about exploring a new planet. The children will be writing in the first person, using descriptive language written in the past tense. In topic we are learning about constellations and creating 3d constellations. In PSHE, we are learning about the emergency services. During our RE lesson, we are continuing to learn about miracles. Whilst in Maths, we will learn the concept of angles as degrees of 'turn', and on comparison, identification and measurement of angles. We will also be learning about Polygons and Quadrilaterals. Beech Class will continue swimming every Thursday this half term.

<p>In Year 3 Next week in Maths, we will be aiming to strengthen our understanding of time and time intervals. In English, we will be writing up a newspaper article based on an erupting volcano. In our new topic 'Active Planet', we will be building on the children's knowledge of tectonic plates and how they form from the earth.</p> <p>Have a lovely weekend.</p>	<p>In Year 6 In Year 6 next week, we will be writing a short story based on a video clip that we will be watching during our English lessons. In Maths, we will be revising 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. In Science, we will be recapping the topic of Plants, which the children were taught during Year 3. In PSHE, we will be learning about the importance of the emergency services. Please also remember your child's PE kit for Wednesday. Have a great weekend.</p>
<p>In Sycamore Class The children will begin looking at character, plot and sequencing in 'Dumbo' and the 'Lion King'. They will also look at Non Fiction writing about Africa and we will begin to look at African Kente weaves. In Maths, the children will be looking at 'one more, one less, each and left' and some other key mathematical words and concepts according to the progress questions they did this week using visual support. The older children will continue with Maths lessons following the Abacus objectives as usual. We will concentrate further on asking for help and starting conversations. The children will also do weekly handwriting, spelling and grammar. At all other times children will attend mainstream lessons where possible.</p>	<p>In Willow Class Thank you to all parents and outside support for coming to our coffee morning. Feedback suggests that it was enjoyed by all. This week we have begun to talk about winter's end and the beginning of spring and what that means such as we will start to see new leaves on the trees, flowers and buds growing, new baby animals, warmer weather, sunshine, showers and maybe a rainbow or two. Please point out and discuss with your child when you are out and about. We have also been learning the names of female and male baby farm animals, the noises they make and the by-product they produce e.g. cow/bull/calf and a cow produces milk that we drink. We will continue working on letter and number formation, counting, spelling and the correct formation of their name (only initial letter as a capital letter and the rest lower case).</p>
