


Free School Meals

Next Week: We will read the story, Farmer Duck. As we settle into our environment we are beginning to learn how to tidy up and help our friends. 





Welcome back! We hope you all had a lovely half term break. The children have settled back into school life well and have enjoyed being with their friends again.

Next week, in our writing sessions, we will be reading more of our story George's Marvelous Medicine before experimenting with different verbs, adverbs and adjectives to describe his feelings towards Grandma and the process of making the new medicine. In maths, we will be learning how to add and subtract two 3-digit numbers using the column method, and in science, we will be learning how metamorphic rock is formed. In music, we will be making instruments from the objects around the classroom, before writing our own musical notations, and in Geography, we will be identifying and describing different settlements.



Year 5 has had a wonderful week. We have started a new book called 'The Lost Happy Endings' by Carol Ann Duffy in writing and the children are enjoying reading a different style and genre of book. The ending of our previous book 'The boy at the back of class' is still a subject of great debate in our classes. In Maths we have been investigating multiples and factors of numbers using our multiplication knowledge to help us. In science we have started the topic of Earth and Space and the children have been trying to remember the order of the planets in our solar system. In history we have began learning about the major achievements from the Early Islamic Civilisation, the children have found this to be most enlightening.

Year 6

We hope yourselves and your children have had a restful half term and are excited to begin the second half of Autumn term. It was wonderful to see so many of you at parent's evening but if you were unable to attend, do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher via class Dojo; we would be happy to arrange a phone call to discuss your child's progress.

This week, the children have settled back into school well and have had a great week. In literacy, we have begun our new book The Arrival. This book is unique in that it has no words but uses pictures to tell story. The children have greatly enjoyed delving into this text and we cannot wait to see what fantastic writing they produce when writing their own journey stories. In mathematics, we are learning to compare and order fractions and will move onto converting from mixed numbers to improper fractions. Our science topic for this half term is 'Living Things and their Habitats'. This week we have been learning to classify using a dichotomous key and will move on to creating our own.

May have seen, we are now sending out full homework. This is to include: reading comprehension, maths arithmetic and reasoning and grammar. This will be sent home in a coloured plastic folder. Please ensure that this is completed by your child and returned. Homework is sent out every Friday and to be handed back in on the following Wednesday. Please do support us with this as the children do have upcoming assessments.

Finally, just a reminder that as the weather turns colder, please ensure your child wears a coat to school and this this is named.


