The Orchard

This week, we read *The Day You Begin*, by Jaqueline Woodson. There are many reasons to feel different. Maybe it's how you look or talk, or where you're from; maybe it's what you eat. The children enjoyed analysing this story and sharing their thoughts.

Next week, we will read the book "Leaf" written by Sandra Dieckmann. When a polar bear arrives unexpectedly in the woods, the animals fear and avoid him, suspecting him to be dangerous - and his habit of collecting leaves only adds to their distrust. Then one day, they watch as he attempts to fly over the water with wings made of colorful leaves...just trying to go home.
