We've had a brilliant week in Year 3! The children have really enjoyed their new history topic on the ancient Egyptians, and they had lots of fun creating a new medicine for George's grandma in our writing session! Next week is antibullying week and on Monday we will be taking part in Odd Sock Day. We would love to see the children coming to school in their odd socks!

Next week, in our writing sessions, we will be planning our narratives as we prepare to rewrite the story of George's Marvelous Medicine. In maths, we will be beginning a new unit on multiplication, and in science, we will be learning how fossils are formed. In history, we will be learning the cultural changes that occurred during the Egyptian period using historical evidence, and in geography, we will be learning about rural and urban areas before identifying the different types of homes people live in.


