






#### **European Day of Languages**

## Nursery News

What a wonderful week at nursery; the children are becoming more familiar with their classroom and are beginning to build meaningful friendships with their peers. Well done Little Acorns! Next week in literacy, we will be reading a variety of 'All about me' stories such as 'My Five Senses' to encourage the children to explore and talk about themselves and their likes and dislikes.

In numeracy, we will introduce NumberBlocks and explore different aspects of number one to support children to develop a deeper understanding of number one.

In phonics, nursery children will begin their phonics journey from phase 1 phonics stage which is the first stage of the phonics programme. At this stage, our focus will be primarily on developing the children' speaking and listening skills while they enjoy learning nursery rhymes and playing fun sound discrimination games. We would like to encourage parents to play" I Spy" with their children and to practise counting in the environment.

# Reception News

We have had a lovely week in Reception, it has been lovely to continue to see the wonderful progress all of the children have made as they get used to school routines and settle during their second full week altogether. In Literacy next week our focus story will be 'The Three Little Pigs'. We will be focussing on children's language, asking comprehension questions that encourage the children to think about what happened in the story and why some of the houses did and did not fall down. To support your child, over the weekend you may want to share some of your child's favourite stories with your them, asking your child to talk about what happened and why. In Numeracy we will be continuing to focus on number, singing number songs and recognising numerals 0-10 within our environment.





## Year 5

Year 5 have had yet another engaging week of learning. We have continued reading our class read aloud 'The boy at the back of the class' and we've been looking into what means to be a refugee or migrant and what are the difference between them. In Maths we have been building upon our knowledge of place value up to one million! In science we have been investigating the complete and incomplete metamorphosis of insects and amphibians. In geography we have been looking at the country of Belgium and its physical features and in history we have been learning about early civilisations.





### The Orchard

This week, we have read and worked on the story *The Heart and the Bottle*, written by **Oliver Jeffers.** The story explores feeling/emotions, love and loss. In class we discussed how the girl might have felt and why as well as what emotions/feelings they would bring about and how we would feel.

In maths, we have continued to consolidate our learning of place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication, 1 to 1 correspondence and 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. In science, we continued learning about what is essential for human, animal growth including survival. Next week, we will read the book *Catherine and the lion*, by Clare Jarrett, a story about a girl called Catherine who wakes to find a smiling lion looking down at her. This story is about a beautiful friendship that occurs due to a lovely big change at home.
