


What is the HAF Programme?

Year 4

This week, the children worked hard showing of their learning. They deserve a well-deserved rest this weekend. The children gained a lot of understanding of the Hindu religion by going to the Shree Ganapathy Temple. Thank you to those who helped us walk the children to and from the temple. We all really appreciate it. Next week in English, we will finish reading our book, 'Moon Man' by Tom Ungerer. After, we will write our own story based on the book we have been reading. We've had an extremely productive week in Year 5. 

Year 6

This week, year 6 have been working hard. In English this week, we have been writing an independent narrative based on our book 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan. In maths, we have been learning about how to multiply and divide fractions. In geography, we have been identifying and explaining the different layers of the rainforest. In history, we have been looking at the impact of the Industrial Revolution on the world today. In DT, we have started to create some applique bookmarks. In Spanish, we have been learning about holidays. In reading, we have been read about the fascinating life of Frida Kahlo. On Friday, the children we able to choose a bundle of two books, that they are able to keep. This will continue each half term, totalling 6 books throughout the course of the year.

Next week, children will be reviewing all their learning on fractions over the past few weeks. In Reading, we are looking at a text on Banksy, answering inference questions, working on pace and vocabulary. In PE, we will continue to be working on our balance and coordination, and object control. Our Bikeability course will be running, and the selected children will need to bring in their bikes each day. I am pleased to announce that kookaburra house have won the Dojo points for this half term, which means that they will be able to wear a yellow accessory to school on Friday 1st Dec.

We have seen a good improvement in school uniforms and PE kits, but please can you continue to ensure that children are following the rules for these.

The Orchard

This week, we have read another fairy tale, the story of **Little Red Riding Hood**. The children enjoyed working on this story whilst the older children also looked at other versions of the story namely, **Little Red Riding Hood and the Lion**. During the literacy lessons, we talked about it: retelling the story, answering questions, describing the characters and eating Gingerbread Man biscuits. In maths, we are focusing on addition and subtraction using different methods (dienes, counters, column method).
