Swimming is returning:

Next week, the build of our pool will begin so that we can facilitate our children's swimming lessons on site meaning minimal disruption and loss of time to the rest of their learning. Swimming is part of the national curriculum and therefore it is mandatory that all children are given the opportunity to access swimming lesson which aid them in reaching the key indicators which are; Perform safe self-rescue in different water based situations, Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of **at least** 25 metres and Use a range of strokes effectively, for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke. This swimming timetable will be sent out through ClassDojo next week. The teachers and lifeguards have changed from last year and you can read more information on him below.

Nursery News

Next week, we will be reading the story of 'Love Makes a Family' by Sophie Beer. This book demonstrates that what's most important in each family's life is the love the family members share. 

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Year 2



Year 4


We hope you have had a lovely week. We are very pleased with the progress your children are making. Please do everything you can to support your child with their learning, any support you need, please let your child's class teacher know.



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Year 6


This week, Year 6 have settled back into their usual routine after 'Show Off Week'. In writing, we have begun our new book *Letters from the Lighthouse* by Nina Bawden. The book is set in WW2 Britain and covers the story of Olive and her brother who have been evacuated to the Devonshire countryside. There they uncover a mystery that they must solve. Based on this narrative, we shall be writing both a fiction and a non-fiction text. In mathematics, we are continuing with our unit on Algebra, applying formulae to solve reasoning problems.

In Science, we are continuing with our Evolution and Adaption topic and in history, we shall continue with our WW2 focus, exploring what was like for evacuee children. In Art we shall be creating block prints with text.
