In numeracy, we will practise subitizing up to 3 objects. Over

In maths we will be looking at number bonds, using different tools to support our learning and looking at what the sum looks like written down.



Year 4

Happy New Year to all. We hope you had a good holiday. The children have settled back into school quite nicely and have settled into their learning. They have shown they are ready for more learning.

Next week in English, the children will be continue rewriting the plot of the story we have started reading this week, 'The miraculous journey of Edward Turlane' by Kate DiCamillo. The focus will be ensuring children understand how to use fronted adverbials to sequence their story. In Maths, the children will be learning how to solve maths problems using multiplication working with numbers up to 3 digits.

Key Dates:

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Year 5

It has been lovely to see the children return from their holidays full of energy and ready to learn. We've had an extended week including the 2 days of school last week and it's been jam packed. We have started reading a new class book called 'Viking Boy' by author Tony Bradman, and it's also the focus of our writing this term where the children will produce an independent piece of writing based on a conquering tale. In Maths we are revisiting multiplication and division, throughout the week we have gradually built up our confidence in multiplying up to a 4-digit number by a 2-digit number. In science we have looked at what it means to be healthy, the 7 nutrients needed by our bodies, their sources, and the 3 types of exercise our bodies need to maintain fitness. In Geography we have begun map reading and in History we have started exploring the origins of Anglo-Saxon's and the impact of their arrival.

Next week we have our very exciting Wonder Dome workshop, please remember to make your child's payment for this on MCAS.

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Year 6

We hope you had a wonderful Christmas and new year. What a busy start we've had back into year 6! We are learning about World War 2 and spent History learning the reasons WW2 happened. Our English book coincides with our topic of WW2; we are reading Rose Blanche. Our classes have already written detailed setting descriptions and started Tales of fear. In Maths, the children have looked into ratio and how to solve ratio problems. In P.E. we practiced our defense using basketballs. We are also revisiting fitness and retesting to compare to our baseline to see if we've improved. In R.E. we are comparing Holy books and in PD, we've come up with strategies on showing patience (our habit of the term).



In Music, we will be looking at music in WW2 and its impact. In Science, we are looking at the difference between inherited and acquired traits.

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The Orchard

This week, the children worked on the story: **'Last Stop on Market Street' written by Matt de la Pena and illustrated by Christian Robinson.** This is a heartfelt story set in a town in South America whereby a boy called CJ and his nana catch a bus to a soup kitchen at the end of Market Street. The story is told through their eyes, of the world that surrounds them, ie. the beauty and kindness that nana sees and that which CJ initially takes for granted or doesn't. It's a story about culture, class and generation. In maths, the focus is on money. In science, we are focusing on learning about different materials and their properties and in geography, we are looking at our school surroundings through maps and aerial views. Theme: Heritage and Culture Next week's story of the week is: 'The Colours of Us' by Karen Kats.
