EDI (Equality, Diversity and Inclusion)



This week we began discussions about how we will be marking LGBT+ History Month by looking at Section 28. Section 28 was part of the Local Government Act 1988, which stated that a local authority "shall not intentionally promote homosexuality or publish material with the intention of promoting homosexuality"; or "promote the teaching in any maintained school of the acceptability of homosexuality as a pretended family relationship". The resultant effect of this was teachers and other school staff becoming fearful of doing what they felt, and knew, to be the right thing.

LGBT+ History Month began in 2004, but it has never been more needed than it is now; LGBT+

communities are facing higher levels of discrimination and hatred. At Shirley Park Primary LGBT+ History Month gives us another great opportunity to engage with all too often hidden LGBT+ histories, by providing positive education about lesbian, gay, bisexual and trans lives. It is important to recognise that LGBT+ people have always been members of our communities, whether that be where we live, work or engage in education. This year's theme of "Science and Medicine" highlights that LGBT+ people are also the people who have made a difference in medicine and healthcare. LGBT+ people are our doctors, nurses, care assistants and scientists.

Comic Relief Red Nose Day




This year Comic Relief Red Nose Day falls on **Friday 15th March**.

Nursery News

Next week, we will be reading the story <u>Goldilocks and the Three Bears</u>. We will be discussing whether Goldilocks should have gone into the house, and how the bears felt. The children will be given the opportunity to make their own porridge in class.

In numeracy, we will continue singing our number songs and practicing how to show numbers in different ways.

How you can help at home:

- 1. Point out numbers that are in our environment for example, on packaging, buses, road signs, door numbers and so on.
- 2. When preparing breakfast, lunch, or dinner, ask your child to lay four forks on the table, how many peas on their plate? And if they have eaten two peas how many are left?

<u>Letter Sounds of the Week: 'g'.</u> On Phonic Monday, children will be exploring the body percussion by playing sound games. We will also be working on mark making and giving meanings to marks we make.

Please practice saying this sound and the sounds that we have previously learnt 's, a, t, p, i, n, m, d' including their initial letter sound in your child's name, at home. We shall be introducing simple CVC words to challenge children's phonic knowledge



In literacy next week, we will be linking with our topic 'Our Planet and Space', reading the book 'I am Earth' by Rebecca and James McDonald. In topic lessons, we will be focussing on the Earth, Sun and Moon. We will think about what makes our planet special, our oceans, seas and lakes, and learn what gravity is. In maths, we will be focussing on the number 6. We will be counting 6 things, grouping into 6, using dice and subitising (looking at a representation and instantly recognising the quantity without counting) to 6.

Year 1

The children have had a lovely week in Year 1. They have enjoyed learning about the different planets in our solar system in our science lesson and had lots of fun testing out different paint brushes in their art lesson.

Next week, in our English lessons, we will be writing our own versions of the story 'George and the Dragon' before editing them. In maths, we will be using the terms 'greater than' and 'less than' to compare different numbers, and in our science lesson, we will be learning about major events in space travel, such as the moon landing. In history, we will be discovering how a new monarch is chosen and test to see if it is fair, and in Geography, we will be creating an aerial view map of a room, including a key to identify what they pictures are.

Lunches: We are a nut free school; therefore, we ask that anything that may contain nuts is not included in pack lunches please.



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

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Year 5

We have had a great week in Year 5! We hope you have a great weekend.


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The Orchard

This week, we worked on the story: **The Colors of Us by Karen Kats.** Seven-year-old Lena is going to paint a picture of herself. She wants to use brown paint for her skin, but when she and her mother take a walk through the neighbourhood, Lena learns that brown comes in many different shades.
