

Nursery News

Dear Parents, Next week, we will be reading the book <u>Wriggle and Roar with Rhymes.</u> This book will animate, engage, and stimulate our sense of rhyming while we giggle and wriggle.

In math, we will be making comparisons between objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity. <u>Letter Sounds of the Week: 'b'</u> In phonics, the children will spend time learning the alphabet rap and playing sound discrimination games, including exploring CVC words, such as c-a-t, p-a-t, s-a-t, b-a-t. We will continue to practice on mark making and giving meanings to the marks we make. <u>World Book Day:</u>

Each March we celebrate World Book Day, with an exploration of books, stories, dressing up and props in Nursery. Sharing stories, books, and rhymes every day helps to support child development in many ways, including learning sounds, words, language and developing early literacy skills.

Reception News







Year 3 have had a good week. The children really enjoyed their science lesson where they completed an investigation to see which materials generates the most friction. Next week, in our writing sessions, we will be reading the end of our story, 'The Secret of Black Rock' and the children will begin planning their own narrative based on the book. In our arithmetic lessons, we will be learning how to find the perimeter of a shape and in science, we will be finding out how magnets work. In music, we will be learning how to play a song with the ocarinas and in art.

Year 4

Well done to the children for their learning this week. They are making progress. As the term goes forward, we are really focusing in ensuring your children learn their times tables. Please keep practising with your children. Speak to your child's class teachers about how they are preparing for their times table tests in May as they may be able to offer advice if you need anything. Next week in English, the children will be continuing their writing around Iron Man by Ted Hughes.

They will be focusing on doing a character description of the Iron Man as he progresses through the story.

In Maths, the children will continue learning about fractions, focusing on equivalent fractions and learning how to add 2 fractions.

Previous messages from last week include, in preparation for the Year 4 multiplication tests in May, please encourage your child to learn their times table daily.

Year 5

Year 5 have had a fabulous week. We have loved reading our class book called ' Skellig' by David Almond. Year 5 have been working hard on a descriptive piece of writing focusing on the discovery of the man in the garage at the beginning of our book. We have focused on the use of fronted adverbials and the creation of suspense through short sentences.

In Maths we have finished our work on decimals to the thousandth position and have begun our unit on perimeter and areas of a 2d shape. The children have taken to the unit brilliantly and have shown real effort and gusto! We look forward to our work on graphs next week!

In science we have continued our unit on forces. This week we have completed an investigation looking at friction and measuring its effects using newton meters.

In DT we have continued the planning process for our Viking themed CAMS structure. We Hope to build a working model by the end of the half term.

The Orchard



In maths, we have continued practicing multiplication and division of 5's and 10's, and in science we are still exploring the properties and uses of everyday materials – looking at waterproof, absorbent and non-absorbent materials and floating/sinking.
