



## Year 1

The children have had a lovely week in Year 1. They particularly enjoyed taking part in World Book Day and receiving their two new books. We had many more fun activities throughout the day such as a virtual author visit and a parade in the hall where the children showed off their amazing outfits! Next week, in English, we will be starting our new book. 'The Jolly Postman' and will spend our first lesson working out which fairytale characters the letters are written to by reading their addresses. 


# Year 3



# Year 5

Year 5 have had an excellent week. We have continued reading our class book 'Skellig' by David Almond. Year 5 have been working hard on a descriptive piece of writing focusing on using similes and metaphors and I piece of suspenseful writing.

In Maths we have begun looking at line graphs and interpreting data. The children have enjoyed collecting their own data and plotting their results on to their own graphs. The children have taken to the unit brilliantly and are continuing to stretch themselves and their learning! In science we have continued our unit on forces! We have begun looking at the effects of air resistance and how it effects





the rate of decent of objects. To test this, we have tested three different parachutes and their rate of descent. The children were very engaged with the experiment were able to discuss the differences in the results expertly!

In PSHCE this week we have discussed international women's day, the work of the suffragettes in progressing women's lives in Britain and how things have changed over the last 150 years. As a part for this work, we have looked at the impact and impressive work of women's rights activist Malala Yousafzai. It was wonderful seeing everyone dressed up in their outfits for world book day! Year 5 enjoyed having the opportunity to talk about their favourite books as well as having the chance to choose two new books to take home! Don't forget to use your voucher and keep reading!

# Year 6


