Year 4

Next week in English, the children will be learning how to write a poem based on the text we are still reading (Iron Man, by Ted Hughes), looking at figurative language. In Maths, the children will be learning

how to answer reasoning questions, based on the topics of fractions we have covered this term. We will be using manipulatives to help us form our answers.

Year 5 have had yet another busy week. We have continued reading our class book ' Skellig' by David Almond. Year 5 have been working hard their descriptive piece of independent writing focusing on using similes and metaphors to build suspense.

In Maths we have continued looking at line graphs and interpreting data and in science we have sustained our focus with experiments looking at different types of forces. We have continued to investigate the effects of air resistance and how it effects the rate of decent in objects.

It was wonderful seeing everyone dressed in touches of red for Red Nose Day! Year 5 thoroughly enjoyed this.



Year 6

This week the children received their new iPad. We have been busy writing non chronological reports on snowy owls, toads, and rats (based on our book Harry Potter and different characters pets). In Math, we have been learning to read and interpret pie charts and line graphs. During these lessons, we've used our





prior learning on fractions to find answers. In Science, we are doing an experiment to see if the number of bulbs in a circuit affects the brightness. In computing, we have learnt how to calculate difficult sums on excel using formulas. In geography, we've continued to explore actions to take on our global goals affordable and clean energy and climate change) and made video adverts to promote these actions.

Next week is our show off week, our final practice SATs before May. We are really proud of the progress the children have made this year and are looking forward to seeing them thrive again next week. In the afternoons, we will continue with swimming and orienteering. In PD, we will continue to work on our habit of forgiveness. In RE, we are learning about meditation.
