EDI: This week during our EDI sessions we have begun debunking Misconceptions About Muslims and Islam. Stereotypes are beliefs about an entire group that may be based on information about an individual or a small number of people within that group. People use stereotypes to make snap judgments about others without looking at them as individuals. Stereotyping is almost always negative and is always harmful because it makes unsubstantiated generalizations and ignores the humanity of the people being stereotyped. Stereotypes about Muslims range from insults about terrorism to misunderstandings about the meaning of Allah. During the next staff sessions, we will be looking at the four common stereotypes about Islam and discussing why the stereotype is incorrect and wrong.

Islam is a religion that promotes violence and terrorism.

Islam guides followers to oppress women.

Women are forced by men to wear a headscarf, or hijab, as a sign of submission.

Speech and Language Therapy petition:

Mikey's Wish, backed by the Royal College of Speech and Language Therapists (RCSLT) have launched a petition to appeal to the government to fund more Speech and Language Therapy. At time of writing this it has around 6700 signatures. This is less than 10% of the waiting list for SaLT in children and young people's services in England. It needs to get to a far bigger audience. Year 1



Year 5

We have continued reading our class book 'Skellig' by David Almond. Year 5 have begun work on a diary entry based on chapter 20 of our story. We will be looking at the features of a diary entry as well as how to make effective use of subordinating conjunctions. In Maths, we have now completed our work on interpreting tables and statistics. The children were able to reflect their knowledge in a practical way by estimating time and scheduling on bus and train timetables. We have also begun to revise some of our learning on fractions ahead of our work on subtracting mixed fractions next week.

This week we visited St. Lukes church to learn more about the easter story and why it is so important for Christians. We discussed the holy week leading up Easter Sunday and the significance that each day plays in the story of Jesus' reaction. We are very pleased with the engagement, questioning and respect shown by all pupils on this trip, and we look forward to our next visit to St. Lukes!

Year 5 have continued working on their CAMS project as a part of their DT, we continue to be impressed and proud of the effort going into the work and cannot wait to see the finished results!

There will be no homework this half term break, however we ask that you practice your young voices songs and continue practicing your spellings from this half term! We also ask that you all try to experience new things this half term and create new memories!


